Greetings to my fellow Hinxtonians. I hope you have all had a good summer.



# **Parish Council News**

Notes from Parish Council Meeting held 14th July 2025

Wellcome Trust Campus Development.

Recent Liaison meeting with Urban and Civic:

Permission has now been given for Parcel D - Lab buildings and for Parcel A – new homes and amenities. Contractors have been appointed. The new bridges will be constructed on the site and then lifted into place when ready. Some work on the Highway will be done later but expected to cause minimal disruption. All work will be carried out under the Considerate Construction scheme. ANPR cameras will be put in to look for any construction traffic going through villages- any contractor in breach will be taken to task and contracts discontinued.

Discussions will be undertaken to see how residents will have open access to the grounds. U & C asked how they could help the Parish eg upskilling for residents and groups; a way of giving back to the community. It was suggested that this was not very specific, so more details will be asked for. U & C have helped previously with cleaning the Playground, upgrading the Church carpark and helping with the Ickleton Lion.

They have also expressed an interest in offering help to the Hinxton Mill, and at some point, will be watching the Mill in action.

New Road junction- nothing to be done now but a safety audit will be undertaken.

<u>Village Hall extension</u> James Tipping from the Planning department has given approval to the application and the next amount of money will be released for the next stage of the design and planning. Andy Brown asked about having authority to approve payments and accounts; it was confirmed that he could do this.

A presentation will be given at the next meeting of the Parish Council on the 8<sup>th</sup> Sept. The meeting will start at the earlier time of 7pm so that the presentation will be held first, followed by the PC meeting. A notice will be put in the Hinxton News and on the website. A question was asked whether the outside of the present Hall would be changed. There are 3 options- do nothing, add render, or put on shiplap. Having either render or shiplap will help with insulation.

We have had confirmation from accountant that we will be able to reclaim VAT if we register for VAT. This means that VAT will need to be added to hiring the Hall. Grants for solar panels will be looked for.

<u>Playground.</u> Following the ROSPA Safety report, a quote was obtained from Playsource for remedial work needed. It was agreed to ask Playsource to carry out the works required for the equipment.

<u>Quiet Lanes.</u> Nothing received back from Duxford yet, need to speak to Peter McDonald and Highway for next stage. Some confusion re the definition of Quiet Lanes; this is to make the road safer but not shut completely.

<u>Dog poo bin location.</u> 2 new bins now installed; one by the entrance to the Mill and one by the Ford. Discussion was held whether to relocate the old small bin from the Mill to

somewhere in the north of the village. The corner triangle of grass where North End Rd and High St was a possible location; however it was decided to monitor the area to see whether one is needed here. If there are reports of dog mess not being cleared, then we will revisit this to see where to put it. Thoughts from residents about this welcomed.

<u>Highways.</u> McDonalds roundabout- this has now gone back to the drawing board. Local Highway Initiative, our application has been reviewed, a decision to be made re one way system in Hunts Lane, expected to hear in Oct. 20mph, this has again been applied for, waiting to hear back.

<u>Hinxfest.</u> At the previous meeting, Ceri Williams asked for a breakdown of the costs as to how much would be needed to fund the events. Mike Boagey produced this which was for approx. £419 for the materials and a donation of £100 to make the items. Ann Howsden charity would fund the children's party and Wellcome will be asked to provide the printing. It was proposed to donate £519 towards the costs - all in agreement.

<u>Public Participation.</u> Question asked re the permissive paths: are they now accessible? Fence has been repaired, paths need cutting, Clerk to contact Bidwells.

<u>Water leak in North End Rd</u>- water company do not want to close the road while schools are still open as it will cause disruption. It was thought that it was better to cause disruption to stop the leak, Peter McDonald will contact Streetwise to see what is happening.

<u>Alex Clarke at the Red Lion has offered help</u> for when the Village Hall is being extended. Thanks given for his offer, will be looked at nearer the time. The Church will be available as well for holding Parish meetings.

<u>VJ day, 15th August</u>, flag raising ceremony to be held on the day. Details will be in Hinxton News and on the website and Facebook. (Editor's note: these notes are from the July meeting and the event took place)

It is hoped that this article may help people make the most of <a href="www.hundredparishes.org.uk">www.hundredparishes.org.uk</a> You are encouraged to step through the menu to get a feel for what is available. If you want to look something up, you might try either Parishes, What's On, Articles or Walks.

**Parishes** holds the key to lots of things. From either the map or the alphabetical listing, select an individual parish to find out a little about its history, the nearest walks or details for a pub or tea room. Introductions include ideas for further reading and links to useful websites.

What's On lists future events in chronological order. Many entries have a link to further information. We are pleased to give publicity to any event that promotes local knowledge or culture, exploration or conservation.

Articles offers local insight into a wide range of topics.

Walks has general guidance and then three options: Station walks, Quiet Lane walks and Other walks. Scroll down the list to find one that suits your need in terms of location and distance. Then click on the walk number to call it up. The first few paragraphs will describe distance, terrain and opportunities for refreshment. When you find a walk you like, print it to take with you. [Control, P] is a useful shortcut to start printing.

**Feedback** is a way of telling us of changes or something we have missed – perhaps a pub closure, bus route change, additional activity for **What's On**, or website links or phone numbers that no longer work.

I hope these notes have been useful and may make your visits to the website more rewarding.
